Temple Beth El Cantor's Message

Purim Tidbits

A man comes to his rabbi and says, "Rabbi, I don't know what to do! My family, thank God, is growing so that we have no room in the house. I need to add an extension, but have no idea how."

The rabbi replies, "It just so happens that I am studying a section of the Talmud where they bring up this very question. It includes plans for an addition. Let me make you a copy, and you can use them." After offering the rabbi profuse thanks, the man takes the plans and leaves.

Five weeks later, the man returns to the rabbi. "Rabbi," he says, "I followed the instructions you gave me to the letter, and no sooner did I finish the extension than it collapsed on itself. Why did it do that?"

The rabbi says, "You know, Rashi asks the same question."

There was a synagogue in Texas where the rabbi gave wonderful *divrei Torah*. Unfortunately, one weekend a member had to visit Long Island for his nephew's bar mitzvah, but he didn't want to miss the rabbi's sermon. 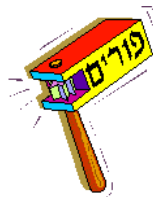

Temple Beth El Executive Director's Message



Dear Friends,

Since this article is for "the bulletin" we have to be sure to let our readers know what to look forward to in March, and going forward.

We will observe Purim on Wednesday March 20th at Temple. We are having a hot dog supper with all the fixings – potato salad, coleslaw, beans and more followed by the reading of the Megillah.

Purim, a holiday that recognizes Esther as our heroine, is a story of romance, loyalty, faith and courage. As in much of our history, we are assured that despite oppression and anti-Semitism the prevailing tyrant in this case Haman, will ultimately be overthrown.

Purim is a holiday of feasting, costumes, masks, gaiety, noise from the groggers, hat shaped cookies – reminders of Haman's three cornered hat – filled with fruit and poppy seeds, gifts and goodies as directed in the Megillah.

Pious Jews fast on the day before Purim to honor Esther, who did not eat for three days before visiting with the King, who she was seeing without being invited. Purim is the only time a Jew is allowed to get so 'high' that he literally "does not know" the difference between cursed Haman and blessed Mordeca – this is known as Adelayada – the gay quality of Purim.

Did you know Esther's Hebrew name was Hadassah? The Woman's National Zionist Organization, which came into existence on Purim and was named for her. Purim never falls on the Sabbath and God's name is never mentioned in the Megillah.

If Purim is in March can Passover be far behind – almost one month from the day of Purim is the 1st Seder, Friday night April 19th.

April 19th is also the anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising. We must pay attention to observe the sweetness and the sadness of those days. We will have a joint Seder with Temple Emanu-El on April 19th.

If you check your calendar you will also see that Sunday March 10th is the start of Daylight Savings Time, and Purim is on the first day of Spring. Now I've caught all of us up on some important dates in all our lives.

Please keep in mind the pleasure of participating in Temple Beth El's Centennial Celebration on October 25th and 26th. 100 years is special, everyone is welcome to share our Simcha. We will keep you informed in future bulletins.

The Helen and Leon Sperling Holocaust Education Essay Contest is being developed by members of The Holocaust Committee through The Jewish Community Federation of the Mohawk Valley. For this first year we are excited to present this limited opportunity, for continuous Holocaust education, to students in grades 6-8 who attend or are affiliated with Jewish synagogues and temples in Oneida and Herkimer Counties. All essays will be scored using an objective scoring guide with awards and prizes given to those who place in the top three of all submissions. Following review of input related to this first year, we will offer the essay contest to all students in grades 6-8 and 9-12, who live in the areas served by the Madison-Oneida, Oneida-Madison, and Herkimer-Fulton BOCES regions. These are the areas where our esteemed Helen Sperling presented to students facts about the Holocaust, her personal experiences as a survivor, and why we must speak-up to combat bullying and intolerance. For the future we will also consider expanding this educational challenge to include fine arts and poetry categories.

You have attended or heard about the annual Helen and Leon Sperling Holocaust Lecture. Each year, guests visit with us to share an overview of their experiences as survivors and/or people with first hand, experiences of Holocaust related atrocities and hopes for a better future through Not Being Bystanders. For several years different people have considered embellishing on the annual lecture and Helen's visits to schools. Through challenging students to research and identify with a specific topic we expect students to go beyond what they learn through their school and home education. With greater knowledge we expect students to have greater power when making choices that affect themselves and others.

Thank you for your anticipated support. We hope you will encourage eligible children to participate. Your feedback is important to us and the committee loves to hear input, especially positives.
